See Article History. Olympic Mountains, segment of the Pacific mountain system of western North America. They extend across the Olympic Peninsula south of the Juan de Fuca Strait and west of Puget Sound in northwestern Washington, U.S. The mountains began to form about 35 million years ago when the Juan de Fuca Plate collided with and was forced under (subducted) the North American Plate, scraping off vast quantities of rock onto the continent as it went underneath.

Most of the mountains are protected within the bounds of Olympic National Park and adjoining segments of the Olympic National Forest . The mountains are located in western Washington in the United States, spread out across four counties: Clallam, Grays Harbor, Jefferson and Mason.

Buckhorn Mountain - 16.2 Miles Round-Trip Buckhorn Mountain (6,995') is located 8.1 miles from Tubal Cain Trailhead in the Buckhorn Wilderness.This rugged peak stands over the Copper Creek, Big Quilcene and Dungeness River valleys with views that extend deep into the Olympic Mountains. Buckhorn Pass (north) and Marmot Pass (south) lie on either side, each with summit access.
